The transition of Public Square continued over the centuries quadrant by guadrant. In 2010, Mayor Frank Jackson appointed the Group Plan Commission, a blue-ribbon committee inspired by Daniel Burnham's famed "Group Plan" of a century before, set out to make both the Mall and Public Square reach their potential as appealing destinations for locals and visitors. The reimagined Public Square is scheduled to be completed in June of 2016.
